Dear Dr. Wyss-Dunant,

In accordance with my letter to you of December 12th, I asked Colonel Warren B. PUGH, of the Civil Affairs Section of the U.S. Army here in Casablanca, as to whether there were supplies available, which could be used for the Dakar refugees. I copy from Colonel Pugh's letter of December 12th :

" Reference your letter of December  
" 11th concerning clothing and linen for evacuees  
" from Dakar, you are advised that there are no  
" such supplies available at present. A survey is  
" being made of economic needs of Morocco, but to  
" date the French Mission has submitted no report  
" of needs so far as clothing and fabrics are  
" concerned. I believe that your needs in this  
" respect could be handled more expeditiously thru  
" your own organization. "

I have accordingly cabled our Committee in Philadelphia to see whether they and the American Red Cross together can do something in this way.

Next time I am in Rabat I will also ask if the French Authorities have stated their needs to the French Mission.
