Of course, I know nothing of these people beyond what they have told me themselves, but all three of these gentlemen have been most kind to me since my arrival in Casablanca.

I am sure that the experience of Mr. Monserrat, and Mr. Jung, should be of very considerable value to the Americans.

Mr. Vallin has not the background of either of the above two gentlemen, but he speaks very fluent English, and he would certainly be useful as an interpreter.

You will, of course, wish to form your own opinion independently in all these cases.
