Dear Mr. Leslie Heath,

I was pleased to receive your letter of 19th November and to know that you are still busy in Casablanca with the internees camps questions.

I just got news from Alger, that the camps of Laghouat and Djelfa, perhaps Mecheria were made free. So wrote I to the Residence in Rabat to ask for news about the camps in Morocco. Now I am expecting the answer.

So ever would I been very pleased to meet you again and to discuss with you steps to make to get out the men out of the camps and put them again in normal life. But the question is not so simple as some of them are in any case bad elements unwanted by the Security. So should I propose as I did already to sort the bad from the good elements and to seek jobs for the last ones.

In any case it's not the part of the Red Cross Delegate to follow them after they get free nor to interfere in military questions. So am I waiting first for the answer of the residence and shall reach Casablanca soon after these expected news.

I shall cable you as soon as I shall be able to come. If you intend to meet me sooner let me know by cable and I will be pleased to fetch you at Sidi Slimane,
