RE: Letter of November 2 to Mr. Paul F. Guerin, French Embassy, Washington, in connection with Leslie Heath's letter of October 3, 1942 about medical supplies as well as the shipment of gasoline and oil to be made to Casablanca for Leslie O. Heath.

(1) As soon as we get a go-ahead signal from the B.E.W. and obtain any supplies for shipment on French vessels from New Orleans, we should immediately send a list of the items in question to Mr. Guerin so that he may allocate to you the necessary cargo space.

(2) It should be recalled, in connection with the shipment of gasoline and oil to Leslie Heath, that we promised Mr. Henry Villard of the State Department to let him know as soon as we could in connection with the shipment so that he can advise the U.S. Embassy in Casablanca to cooperate in the reception of the petroleum products there in conjunction with their own supplies, and in the eventual return of the metal containers to this country, as required by the B.E.W.
