This week has been quiet. Few people came in on Monday and Tuesday. In fact, only one refugee was in on Monday, asking us to send a cable to England and one who came for his 100 Esc. for the week. Worked on correspondence, had long nap recuperating from stomach upset during the night (two dizrreahs), went to bed early.

Tuesday, July 28

Likewise quiet, one refugee came in to inquire about immigration news, if any. One asked km us to mand mail some packages which he would supply...H. Winter Worked on checking individual authorization from Philadelphia for paye ments due to be paid by us.

Called on Pan Am airways to collect 200 Esc left by Citriolo. Brynat, however, had spejt it and gave me an I.O.U.

Phil and I also stopped in to see
Maria Sara Rodrigues Carrao d'Oliveira
who had been very kind to Franca case,
to give her some U.S. propaganda I had
picked up from Legation that morning
from Rewinkle, in press dep't.

Had supper with Doc. Jo, returned from Eng. Discussed shipment of food in bulk to F ench internment through Quakes and Int. Red Cross, about which he had heard in London fr m MEW man. We knew nothing of it. Talked of Eng. at war, belt still to be tightened, impression. Of Caldas, and bad feeling developing between Port. and refugees.
