Internment camp "Et de Triage" d'Oued Akreuch - Workers' Group #10 under direction of department of Industrial Production, visited by Dr. Wyss-Dunant 7/22/42 - Camp is 10 km. from Rabat, in a bend of the river.

<u>Personnel</u> - 100 men in camp

120 detached (for projects, etc.)
Capacity 250 - 300 men; - many nationalities represented

The Camp - 15 barrache of cemented stone. Hard earth for floor. Beds have been made with branches and straw; two covers per man. Acetylene highting.

Food - 650 grams of bread, sufficient meat, thanks to the cattle belonging to the camp. Note the menu below.

Canteen - well arranged; it contains a meeting-room.

<u>Clothing</u> - At this time, each man had a shirt, pants, jacket, and pair of shoes. Voluntary workers are cared for first when clothes arrive. The civil internees must take care of their needs themselves.

Hygiene - One washing-machine is in operation. Disinfection of clothes takes place at Rabat. Soap will soon be lacking. Baths can be taken in the river. Makeshift showers have been installed. Lavatories are in the open.

Infirmary - The only medical care is provided by three refugee doctors and a refugee male nurse among the internees. Serious cases are taken to Rabat. The doctors need several medical instruments: stethoscopes, scalpels, forceps, etc.

Salaries - 1.25 frs, plus bonus of 4 or 5 frs. for the workers. Those unskilled or otherwise unfit for work get only 1.25 frs. a day, which is not even enough for writing supplies.

Intellectual and Moral Needs - Games of ninepins, ball, newspapers, magazines. No library.

Mail Service - Daily

Discipline - nothing worth mentioning.

Interview with men - (without witnesses) - We have the following grievances: poor beds, fleas, no medicines. Many internees are without news of their families. Lakk articles of clothing.
