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Library - There are books in the recreation hall, but Spanish books are in great demand, and they are lacking, as are Spanish newspapers and magazines.

Worship - A priest celebrates mass each Sunday.

Salaries - The men earn an average of twenty to sixty francs per day, except for those who work in the camp and who get the five frs. twenty-five rate of the Department of Industrial production.

Discipline - There is a jail and a disciplinary section.

Testimony of the men - (without witnesses) - Brodski Hermann wants a Nansen passport because he is without nationality. He has lived in Paris, rue Spontini, #66, and wishes to gain possession of his furniture. He has written to Geneva but has received no reply.

Two Germans fear they will be claimed by their consulate and treated as deserters.

Some Mugosalavs are forsaken with no news of their families.

No complaints about the camp or concerning food; on the contrary, we have met men in other camps of western Morocco who looked back with longing upon their stay at Bou-Arfa.
