We are about 800 veterans of the Spanish Republican Army who would wish to fight in the ranks of the Allies in order to help the

exterminate our common eanemy

We do not want to enlist in the French Army , the commandment of which is the very one that , for four long years , has humiliated, starved and tortured us

Moreover we cannot trust a commandment that gave the signal

to Franco - German " collaboration " after the Armistice

The viewpoint that I am here exposing is also shared by the sands of Spaniards imprisoned in the numberless camps of N orth by thou-Africa , by all the veterans who had volunteered in the French Army in 1939 and who are now imprisoned in the SOUTH PROVINCE of ORAN, as well as by all Anti - Fascist Aliens who are STILL enduring vexations from the French Authorities

to fight under your orders .

You may be ver under your orders thousands of picked and experimented troops who will fight fiercely for Liberty
