

Dear Friends,

You probably already know that the English have all been released from the concentration camps in Morocco, as have been most of the Poles. It is expected that very soon the Czechs and the Belgians will be released. Such release has been facilitated by the fact that all these nationalities have representatives here.

It is not un-natural therefore that a member of the Austrian refugees in the camps have felt that if some official Austrian Representative could intervene on their behalf, that their release might be hastened.

I do not know if there is any Austrian Representative, or de facto government, existing in London. I find that the following telegram was sent from one of the camps, as follows:

" SIR GEORGE FRANKENSTEIN AUSTRIAN REPRESENTATIVE LONDON

" AUSTRIANS CAMP AYACHI AZEMMOUR BEG TO CLEAR UP AUSTRIANS
" SITUATION IN MOROCCO STOP READY FOR SERVICE KARL WODAK"

Can you tell me anything about the Austrian situation in London?
