Dear Leslie,

We have just received a letter from J. Oettinger confirming the new arrangement for assistance being given to Inge Luck.

As thee perhaps knows, before we heard that thee was coming, we asked Mr. Spanien here to arrange to pay to Luck Esc. 1,000. He informed us that he has given instructions to his Casablanca office of that effect. However, on our part, we never did pay to HICEM this 1,000 Esc. I suppose that thee knows all this already.

On thy Christmas packages and blankets, etc., we are making the necessary inquiries of the Portuguese economic authorities to see what would be exportable. As thee knows, all exports are severely controlled and require a permission from the Economic Ministry. After we find out what can be exported, we will investigate prices and let thee know the answer.

As to Tangier journey, we have not thought much about it lately, as there are several other pending problems which seem more urgent. We will keep thee informed of progress of these items.

The children are still coming through, as far as we can see.

If thee has any general or particular information concerning the internment camp problem as a whole in you area, we would be pleased to share a report of it, as we know literally nothing about it.
