The sentence marked A in the draft is not quite in line with the views endorsed by the Secretary of State on C 299/G.

From the Spanish point of view we shall glad to see the French make a frontier he' rectification in Morocco in favour of Spain, perhaps even up to the limit of the Spanish Claim and of the Convention of 1904. We have mediated in the past about this claim, but the decision went in favour of the French T should however hesitate to say what, in the circumstances, would be regarded as a good offer.

As regards Tangier, the position is that the French Government have reserved all the rights of the French State and those of the Sular Sovereign in the International Zone. We are not in a position to insist that the French should satisfy Spanish claims in the Tangier zone unless we also are prepared to satisfy these claims. We have taken no decision on this point ourselves, the position being that we have reserved all our rights under the Tangier Convention and those of third parties, but are negotiating a modus vivendi with the Spanish Government. Spanish Government.

After consultation with Sir A. Cadogan I suggest that the sentence in the draft should be altered to read as follows: "We should be "in a position to press the French authorities "to give some satisfaction to the Spanish claims Contingent on the Spaniards playing straight".
